2.	The Hampshire Regiment Their badge: the Hampshire Rose
3.	The Royal Field Artillery Their badge: the gun carriage
4.	The Kings Royal Rifles Their badge: a Maltese cross with crown and strung bugle in centre
5.	The Royal Warwickshire Regiment Their badge: the Indian Black Buck Antelope
6.	The Red Cross Their badge: red cross on white background
7.	The Bucks Territorials Their badge: the Buckinghamshire Swan <i>[shown top right of window]</i>
8.	Royal Bucks Hussars An officer’s badge with Buckinghamshire Swan
9.	The Royal Berkshire Regiment Their badge: a Chinese dragon
10.	The Royal Fusiliers Their badge: a stylised flaming grenade
11.	The Gloucester Regiment Their badge: a sphinx
12.	The Army Service Corps (before it acquired the “Royal” in its title) Their badge: a monogram of ASC
